- Use Speech to Text features on Microsoft Office, Google Suite, iOS or Mac

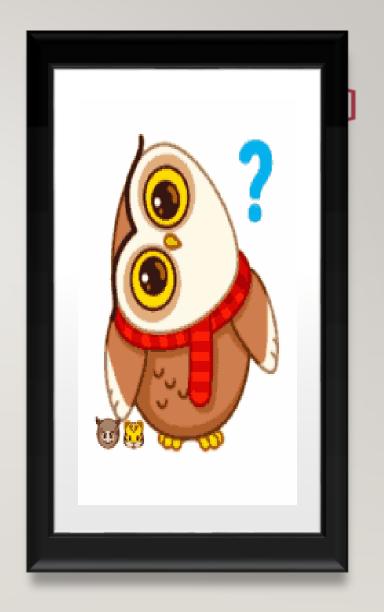
TIPS FOR CANVAS ACCESSIBILITY
