The trends remain constant in terms of gender, age, ethnicity and age. A significant decline in enrollment for WMST 2 occurred after the FT faculty member was on leave and an unqualified adjunct taught the course. Many problems emerged that semester, and the enrollment for WMST 2 has not rebounded since that time.
