The Reed Buffington Award

Biology Instructor Karen Pihl, Ph.D., a founding faculty member who has taught thousands of students over her 35-year career at Las Positas College, is this year's recipient of The Reed Buffington Award for excellence in teaching, considered the highest faculty honor in the district and named in honor of Chabot College's founding president. Thunderous applause and a standing ovation followed the announcement by new Faculty Senate President Thomas Orf, Ph.D. "Over the years, her students have cited her as a major influence in their lives years after they have left Las Positas College," Dr. Orf said. Dr. Pihl guided the biology program from its inception to its current status as one of the largest programs in the college whose graduates have transferred to many four-year colleges and universities.

Chancellor Awards

Chancellor Jannett N. Jackson, Ph.D., recognized three members of the Las Positas College staff and faculty with 2013 Chancellor Awards for their outstanding service to the district. Jennie Graham, Mathematics

Ms. Graham has been a part time faculty member at LPC since January 2007. She has also taught Math at San Joaquin Delta College, Diablo Valley College, and California State University, East Bay. She holds a Master's of Science in Applied Mathematics from CSUEB and her Bachelor's in Applied Mathematics from UC Davis and is a community college graduate from DVC.

Mark Grooms, Business

Mr. Grooms moved to Northern California from Lakewood where he taught at several community colleges in Orange County including Orange Coast College, Santa Ana College, and Fullerton College. Prior to teaching Business, Mr. Grooms worked as a manager and won honors for his work. He holds a Master's in Business Administration from the University of California, Irvine, a Bachelor's in Business from Indiana University, and a Project Management Professional certification from the Project Management Institute; he has studied abroad in Budapest, Hungary.

Ann Hight, Science

Dr. Hight was a tenured Associate Professor at California State University, Sacramento in the Biological Sciences Department from 1994 to 2001 and also has taught at California State University, East Bay; Pueblo Community College in Colorado; and Consumnes River College. She has also co-authored Instructional Anatomy and Physiology videotapes and provided academic content review for two text books. She has been a Post-Doctoral Fellow in Cardiovascular Medicine at University of California, Davis. Dr. Hight earned her Ph.D. in Systemic Physiology from UC Davis, a Master's degree in Biological Sciences from San Jose State, and her Bachelor's degree in Biology from UC San Diego.

Titian Lish, Theater

Ms. Lish was awarded the Performing Arts Educator of the Year by the City of Tracy and Teacher of the Year by Tracy Unified School District where she has taught drama at the Tracy High School Performing Arts Magnet since 2005. She

has managed the annual district drama festival and works with the San Francisco Mime Troupe teaching at-risk youth. Ms. Lish earned a Master of Arts in Drama and a Bachelor of Arts in Drama and Performance from San Francisco State University; she attended the British Academy of Dramatic Arts in Oxford, England and the American Academy of Dramatic Arts in New York.

James Ott, English

Mr. Ott is a well-known teacher, writer, banking CEO, newspaper columnist, television host, Poet Laureate, and civic leader. He has been awarded the Las Positas College Friend of the College Award, the Mayor's Award in Pleasanton, and the Pleasanton Community of Character Award in May 2013.
