Going Green to Stay Green

LPC Uses Recycled Water to Keep Grounds Green; Water Conservation Flows from Sustainability Master Plan

Water conservation is a high priority every day at LPC. The college uses recycled or "purple pipe" water to irrigate lawns and planting areas, keeping the campus green even during drought conditions. Recycled water is wastewater that has undergone a treatment process, but does not meet standards for drinking.

Using recycled water is only part of LPC's overall commitment to leadership in sustainability. Actions include signing the American College and University President Climate Commitment and creating a landmark Climate Action Plan to establish sustainability goals that reflect LPC's

mission and values and move the college toward carbon neutrality. Results are evident across campus: the IceBank energy storage system, photovoltaic solar generation system, electric vehicle charging stations, and LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) certification standards for new building construction, which has been made possible by voter approval of Measure B.

In addition, LPC's commitment to sustainability has slashed energy costs and boosted energy efficiency. Best of all, this commitment creates a sustainable environment that benefits our community now and for generations to come.

LPC Awarded Career Pathways Grant

LPC students will benefit from a \$381,000 grant to help prepare them for careers in the following high-demand fields: advanced manufacturing and engineering, information communication technology, and health science. The grant will also benefit local, regional, and state economies by providing business and industry with skilled workers.

LPC's grant is part of an \$8 million, onetime, three-year-funded grant from the Career Pathways Trust Program awarded to the Diablo Gateways to Innovation Consortium. The consortium includes 37 partners in education, the community, and area business. An additional \$36 million is pledged by the consortium's partners.

LPC to Present Operation Gateway VI for Veterans

LPC will present its sixth annual *Operation Gateway—A Veteran's Transition to Success* on July 17th and 18th. This two-day program serves as an orientation for returning veterans interested in furthering their education at LPC. A wide range of topics will be covered, including course and major planning, registration, readjustment services, college resources, and Post 9/11 GI Bill benefits.

"Operation Gateway is also a great opportunity for veterans to experience firsthand the community and camaraderie that we have here at Las Positas College," said Veterans First Coordinator Todd Steffan.

In addition to informational sessions and workshops, veterans can also meet other veterans and enjoy a barbeque lunch with students, staff, and members from community organizations. Textbook stipends will be available for eligible student veterans.

Operation Gateway is sponsored by the LPC Veterans First Program which provides veterans with services and resources to help them achieve their educational goals. This past academic year, more than 400 veterans or active duty military personnel were enrolled at the college.

LPC veteran support services include a full-time program coordinator, Veterans Resource Center, priority registration, transfer workshops, a book loan program, a study/drop-in tutorial center, work-study program, and an active Student Veterans Organization.
