

Trustees Appoint New Board Member


The Chabot-Las Positas Community College District (CLPCCD) Board of Trustees voted unanimously at its special meeting January 27th to appoint William Macedo as trustee for Trustee Area 7, filling the vacancy created by the December retirement of Barbara F. Mertes, Ph.D. Dr. Mertes leaves a legacy of outstanding leadership and service to the district.

Mr. Macedo and his family have lived in Livermore for more than 40 years. For the past four years, he has served as a member of the district's Measure B Citizens' Oversight Committee, which monitors expenditures of the \$498 million, voter-approved general obligation facilities bond. Mr. Macedo will be sworn in at the board's February 17th meeting. He will serve as trustee until the next election in November 2016.

Actor Tom Hanks wrote a guest editorial, "I Owe It All to Community College," in the January 14th *New York Times* that focused a national spotlight on how Chabot College changed his life. In the editorial, Mr. Hanks wrote, "I drove past the campus a few years ago with one of my kids and summed up my two years there this way: 'That place made me what I am

today.'" His moving tribute to Chabot was prompted by President Obama's proposal to make two years of community college free. Commenting on KTVU's coverage of the story, was TV anchor Gasia Mikaelian who shared on air that she attended LPC.

"Attending Las Positas was one of the best decisions I've ever made," she wrote in a recent letter to LPC. "I completed my general ed classes without the pressure of mounting debt, and allowed myself the freedom of taking any class that interested me." She then transferred to San Diego State University with a clear goal of earning a broadcast journalism degree. "I was 'older and wiser' when I transferred.... If I had started SDSU as a freshman, I doubt I would have been as disciplined as I was as a transfer student."

Ms. Mikaelian posted her gratitude to LPC on her Facebook page. "Thank you, thank you to all the wonderful teachers I had at Las Positas... like Tom Hanks says about his teachers at Chabot—you helped me be the person I am today!"


LPC Holds College Day for High School Seniors and Parents
