LPC and LLNL Win the 2017 East Bay Innovation Award

LPC and Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory (LLNL) have been awarded the 2017 East Bay Innovation Award from the East Bay Economic Development Alliance for the Veterans to Technology education program, a degree program which combines career technical education with hands-on internships.

LPC and LLNL joined forces in 2013 to create the two-year Associate in Science degree in Engineering Technology to meet the demand for

highly skilled engineering technologists in the East Bay. LLNL, alone, expects to hire 300 engineering technologists by 2020. The program was first offered in fall 2014, with the first cohort graduating in 2016. LLNL has already hired six of the first cohort's graduates, with a starting salary of about \$65,000 a year.

For the second year in a row, LPC hosted the California Community College Athletic Association Men's and Women's Basketball State Championships in our gleaming gym, aka The Nest.
