LPC Fire Services Technology is First in State to Receive **FESHE Recognition**

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On May 6, 2019, LPC received approval to be the first Fire and Emergency Services Higher Education (FESHE) recognized Fire Safety Training (FST) program in the State. FESHE was established by the U.S. Fire Administration and is run by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). FESHE has reviewed the Las Positas College curriculum and student outcomes in order to verify that they meet national standards. The program was then reviewed by National Fire Training to confirm that LPC FST courses met the standards. The FST courses received approval by both FESHE and National Fire Training, which allows LPC students to transfer to any FESHE recognized four-year institution to obtain a bachelor degree in Fire Management.

This is a monumental moment for the FST program. Being the first FESHE recognized program in the State places the LPC FST program on the national map. A special thanks goes to Mr. German Sierra for recognizing the value and importance of being nationally recognized and for all the hard work and dedication to get the Fire Service Technology program FESHE certified.

21 years of Service—Trustee Gelles Leaves a Legacy

Trustee Dobie Gelles passed away on Thursday, May 2, 2019. He was part of the Chabot—Las Positas Community College District for 21 years and represented Area 4, which covers Castro Valley and portions of Oakland. It is an incredible loss for the CLPCCD family and condolences are sent to the Gelles' Family. "Dobie's commitment was first and foremost to students," said Interim Chancellor Ronald P. Gerhard. "He believed deeply in community colleges and gave unlimited amounts of time to our district. We are grateful for his service."

Trustee Gelles served as President of the Board twice during his tenure. Working alongside his Board colleagues, he was instrumental in the passage of Bond Measures A and B to build out and renovate both Chabot College and Las Positas College. He was honored as a recipient of the Fulfilling the Trust Award conferred by the Community College League of California for his two decades of service as a California Community College Trustee. The Annual Trustees Conference was developed to help trustees strengthen



the skills and knowledge required to lead their colleges and be accountable to their communities.

"On behalf of the Board of Trustees, we are deeply saddened and send our condolences to the Gelles Family. We will remember Dobie for his two decades of service, dedication, and leadership to our students and community," said Board President, Mr. Edralin "Ed" J. Maduli.

Trustee Gelles served three years in the military and eight years as a reservist. A retired K-12 administrator, Gelles was the Director for Castro Valley Adult School in Castro Valley Unified School District and has been a member of the Eden Hospital Community Board, Castro Valley Unified School District Board, and was President of the Kiwanis and Rotary clubs. He holds a Bachelor of Arts in Science and Math from the University of Pittsburgh and a Masters in Counseling from California State University, Hayward.

BioTech Boot Camp: Grades 10th - 11th

\$100 per student per session Beginning June 17 - 20, 2019 Monday -Thursday 9:00am - 3:00pm, Advanced June 24-27, 2019 Monday - Thursday 9:00am - 3:00pm. The BioTech Boot Camp is for local public high school students who want to experience how biotechnology is being used to diagnose diseases, solve forensic cases, improve the food we eat, and conserve natural resources. Students will learn basic DNA investigative tools in our state-of-theart labs, meet scientists from local biotech companies, and enjoy the college campus experience. To be eligible for the Advanced Camp, students must have one year experience or attended BioTech Boot Camp in the past.

CyberPatriots Cyber Camp: Grades 9th - 12th and LPC Students \$100 per student. No experience necessary June 17 – 21, 2019 Monday - Friday 9:00am - 3:00pm. Cyber Camp is a five-day technology event designed to excite students new to cybersecurity

about STEM careers and teach them important cyber defense skills through hands-on instruction and activities. Cyber Camp culminates in an exciting final team competition that simulates real cybersecurity situations faced by industry professionals and mimics Air Force Association's Cyber Patriot National Youth Cyber Defense Competition.

Digital Media Summer Camp: Grades 9th - 12th, \$100 per student per session, Level: Introduction June 10-15, 2019 Monday - Friday 9:00am - 3:00pm. During the camp, students will explore several industry standard tools including Illustrator, Maya, Photoshop, and Adobe Spark. Over a period of 5 days, students will work both individually and within teams to develop a fictional promotional campaign centered upon a product idea of their choice. At the end of the camp, each student will have a portfolio that includes their product concept in 3D, packaging, and a website for their choisen product.
