To further the progress in implementing the College's institutional goals, President Foster is establishing a new strategic leadership group, the President's Advisory Council on Race and Equity. The Council will serve in an advisory role to the President and make recommendations for action to build upon and enhance equity and inclusion for students and employees at Las Positas College.

The Council's aim is to continue to build a more inclusive and welcoming atmosphere at Las Positas College by recommending actions and initiatives related to, but not limited to the following:

- Assess college policies, procedures, and practices to resolve institutional inequities
- Identify professional development opportunities related to equity and inclusion
- Secure spaces on campus for affinity/student groups to build community
- Establish LPC as a destination campus for traditionally underrepresented groups
- Identify outreach practices that enhance access and diversity and responds to the changing demographics in the Tri-Valley
- Advance faculty and staff diversification

President Speaker Series Presents: Dr. Laura I. Rendón



Laura I. Rendón Ph.D. is a nationally-recognized student advocate, activist scholar and contemplative educator. Rendón is part of a network of public speakers affiliated with SpeakOut-The Institute for Democratic Education and Culture. She has made hundreds of keynote addresses, workshops, and research presentations for national and international colleges and universities, educational organizations and non-profit entities.

Rendón grew up in a low-income, single-parent household along the U.S. Mexico Border in Laredo, Texas where she learned to speak English in the first grade. Rendón is a passionate advocate for low-income, first-generation students who she feels have hopes and dreams but often do not know how to realize them.

Rendón holds professor emerita status at the University of Texas-San Antonio, and has held faculty and administrative appointments at a wide range of universities including the University of South Carolina, North Carolina State University, Arizona State University, California State University-Long Beach, Iowa State University and University of Texas-San Antonio.

Rendón's personal archives are a part of the [*Nettie Lee Benson Latin American Collection*](#) at the University of Texas-Austin, one of the premier libraries in the world focused on Latin America and Latinx Studies.

LPC Proud to be a Caring Campus

Las Positas College has been selected to join the next cohort of colleges participating in Caring Campus California with funding through the generous support of the California Community College Chancellor's Office (CCCCO).

Caring Campus implementation covers a semester of intensive work with IEBC coaches who meet with staff teams, returning approximately every three weeks. "Caring Campus is designed to leverage and enhance a college's existing student success and Guided Pathways efforts, with little to no cost to the institution to implement these interventions," explained Dr. Brad Phillips, IEBC/CEO President. "Connecting with a student doesn't cost anything. Asking a student his or her name doesn't cost anything. You don't have to buy software or build a building. But it is an intensive process, which takes commitment that is facilitated by our coaches and supported by college leadership."

Caring Campus recognizes and leverages the value of connectedness for increasing the likelihood that students will continue towards, and succeed in attaining, their educational goals. Staff interaction with students can set the stage for successful enrollment, persistence, and completion. It is particularly important for students from historically underserved populations, students less familiar with college, non-majority students, students from low-income households, and first-generation students to feel welcome and that they belong in college.



The LPC Classified Senate sought inclusion in this program back in 2020. The leadership team of Classified Professionals and administrative support will begin trainings with IEBC coaches in March 2022.
