LPC President's Scholar Application is Now Open

The President's Scholars Program is a vehicle to provide the opportunity for students in our local service area to attend Las Positas College without any financial barriers. The Scholars program is a financial need-based program that is intended to promote equity by providing financial support to outstanding scholars attending Las Positas College. The program includes a full scholarship that covers tuition, fees, parking, and textbooks for two years. This comprehensive program offers outstanding opportunities for leadership, service and mentorship.

Eligibility to Apply

- Be a high senior in good academic standing with a minimum cumulative 2.5 GPA from within one of the following districts:
 - Livermore Valley Joint Unified School District
 - Dublin Unified School District
 - Castro Valley Unified School District
 - Pleasanton Unified School District
 - San Ramon Unified School District
 - Lammersville Unified School District
 - Tracy Unified School District
- Have applied for admission to Las Positas College for the fall 2023 semester
- Must plan to enroll full-time, at least 12 units, each term, while pursuing an associate degree, with the intent to transfer for a four-year college or university
- Complete the President's Scholars Application
