MESA Grant Awarded to Las Positas College

MESA (Mathematics, Engineering, Science Achievement) is an award-winning, nationally recognized program that aims to help underserved and underrepresented students achieve success in their STEM studies and careers. LPC was awarded a grant of up to \$1.5 million to offer this program at Las Positas College. The amount is subject to annual renewal based upon performance. The MESA program was founded in Oakland, California in 1970, it provides academic support, resources, and career exploration needed to increase the number of minority students graduating from STEM programs.

The MESA Scholars program is the version that will be implemented at Las Positas College. The College was awarded this grant in late 2022 thanks in part to Dr. Nan Ho, Mr. Carlos Moreno, and Dr. Kristina Whalen. Since then, the MESA program coordinators have worked earnestly to prepare the program and accept the first cohort of students in the Spring 2024 semester. A total of 33 students will begin to create LPC's community of STEM learners and achievers.

The Las Positas College's MESA Scholars program aims to increase the successful completion and transfer of underrepresented students in calculus-based science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) fields. The MESA program will include recruitment, holistic student support, student leadership development, and workforce preparation to its participants. In addition, the program aims to increase the sense of belonging and STEM identity for MESA Scholars and value the importance of outside support networks, including their families.

The MESA program will build upon, collaborate with, and leverage existing college efforts in student equity and achievement and connect MESA Scholars to college resources and opportunities. Mr. Carlos Moreno added, "We look forward to future growth and innovation with this important program."

President's Scholars Program has been established to attract the "best of the best" from among the diverse local area high school graduates. The purpose of this program is to promote equity and access by providing financial support to families to impact a student's ability to attend college. Some benefits of the Program include full payment of LPC tuition and fees for up to two years, and an annual \$1,000 stipend (\$500 per semester) for books and other educational materials.
