

College Lingo at Las Positas

Now that your student has started college, you may have heard some terms that are unfamiliar. Here is a list of common terms you may come across during your student's time at Las Positas College.

Add/Drop Period

The add/drop period at the beginning of the semester is the time in which students may make schedule changes without incurring a failing grade.

Asynchronous Online

All activities and work are done online at any time of the day or night in Canvas.

Canvas

LPC uses Canvas as its learning management system to deliver online courses, hybrid courses, and to enhance face-to-face classes with online resources.

Credit Hour (Unit)

Courses are usually measured in credit hours or "units". One unit is equivalent to about 1 hour of class time per week/semester.

DegreeWorks

Degree Works allows you to view your Student Educational Plan and confirm what courses you have completed, as well as what courses remain, toward meeting your educational objective(s).

Federal Work-study

A federally-funded employment program where students are placed in part-time jobs to earn funds and gain work experience.

Full-Time Status

Full time students must be enrolled in 12 or more credit hours. Full-time status is required for many financial aid programs.

HyFlex

Instruction is conducted on campus and online (synchronous and/or asynchronous). Students decide how they want to participate.

Hybrid

Scheduled on-campus meetings are combined with online asynchronous activities.

Office Hours

Designated times for students to meet with professors to discuss material presented in class or ask any questions

Student Education Plan

A Student Education Plan (commonly referred to as an SEP) is a plan with courses listed semester by semester that you will have to take to achieve your academic goal(s).

Syllabus

A document that communicates information about a specific course and outlines important dates and assignments.

Synchronous Online

All class meetings occur live online on scheduled days and times in Zoom.

W Number

A student's W# is their local Student ID number at Las Positas College.
