#### VETERANS FIRST PROGRAM (B. 1000)

• Veteran's Aid for students who have served in the armed forces. Please get a Veteran's Evaluation from Counseling.

## BOOKSTORE (B. 1300)

- Buy books, print cards, bus tickets, scantrons/blue books.
- Buy-back books at the end of semesters.
- Return books **with receipt** within two weeks of class start.

#### PHOTOGRAPHY & VISUAL COMMUNICATIONS (B. 300)

• Students might have classes in this building.

#### ENGLISH LAB (B. 400)

• Students might have an English class in this building.

### COLLEGE CENTER FOR THE ARTS ( B. 4000)

- Performing Arts, Theaters, Amphitheater, and classrooms.
- Some full-time instructors have an office in this building.

#### FIRE SCIENCE/INTEGRATED LEARNING CENTER (ILC) (B. 600)

- Fire Science area to the left.
- ILC from behind; entrance is around the corner.
- Assistance with English, Math, and ESL. Students can get help with essays, research papers, college application personal statements, and any work of writing.

#### <u>COMPUTER LAB, AUTOMOTIVE,</u> <u>WELDING, HORTICULTURE</u> (B. 800)

- Students have access to a number of computers with a variety of programs. They can write reports, print out their work, and receive help from the front desk. Students must have a print card to print work.
- Auto and welding classrooms/labs located at the back of the building.

# SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY CENTER (B. 1800 & B. 1850)

- Most of the Biology, Chemistry, Physics, and Geology classes held in these buildings as well as the labs that accompany those classes.
  Some full-time instructors have an
- office in these buildings.

### <u>CHILDHOOD DEVELOPMENT</u> <u>CENTER (B. 2300)</u>

• Early Childhood Development Department classrooms and childcare facility.

#### LEARNING RESOURCE CENTER (B. 2000)

• AKA the Library. Students can get help with research, print papers using print card, surf the Internet, and use the private study lounges.

## FACULTY OFFICES & CLASSROOMS (B. 2100 & B. 2200)

- Some full-time instructors have an office in 2100. Part-time faculty have shared offices. Check with LPC division staff for the locations as they change from semester to semester.
- Students might have classes in 2200.

# POOL & PHYSICAL EDUCATION BUILDING (B. 2500)

- PE, athletics, and health classes.
- Some full-time instructors have offices here.

### MULTI-DISIPLINARY BUILDING (B. 2400)

- 2401 Tutorial Center (Star Room). FREE tutoring for all subjects; some instructors hold office hours in the TLC.
- Some full-time instructors have an office here. Part-time faculty have shared offices. Check with LPC division staff for the locations as they change from semester to semester.
- Students might have classes in 2400.

# <u>CAMPUS SAFETY, STUDENT</u> <u>HEALTH CENTER (B. 1700)</u>

- Lost and Found located at Campus Safety.
- Medical services available at the Student Health and Wellness Center.

#### STUDENT SERVICES & ADMINISTRATION BUILDING (B. 1600) (New)

- Student Services Vice President.
- <u>FINANCIAL AID:</u> Students can fill out FAFSA and get info on financial aid and scholarships.
- <u>ADMISSIONS AND RECORDS:</u> Register, add, drop, and withdraw classes, transcripts, student ID cards.
- <u>INTERNATIONAL</u> <u>STUDENTS:</u> Offers a variety of student support services designed to give international students the personal attention needed to help them succeed.
- **EOPS:** Extended Opportunities Program and Services assist lowincome and educationally disadvantaged students (lowincome and first in their family to attend college). Students must fill out FAFSA form and qualify for financial aid.
- <u>CALWORKS</u>: Offers support and counseling services for students currently receiving public assistance.
- **DSPS:** Disabled Students Programs and Services is for students with physical and learning disabilities. They offer a class that can test students to see if they have a disability and they also offer help to those who have test anxiety, ADHD, and dyslexia.
- <u>COUNSELING:</u> Drop-in to speak with a Counselor about assessment results, scheduling classes, prerequisite challenges and general information (including career planning and personal counseling). Make an appointment for student education plans, TAA's, graduation application, IGETC certificates, Veteran's evaluations, International Student assistance, assessment testing, and orientations.
- <u>ASSESSMENT CENTER:</u> Placement tests for Math and English.
- <u>STUDENT LIFE/STUDENT</u> <u>GOVERNMENT</u>: Info about student clubs, campus events, and the Student Senate. Obtain free scantrons and blue books.
- <u>ADMINISTRATION:</u> President's Office, Administrative (Business) Services and Academic Services Vice President.
