 - Al is being incorporated (Blackhawk Genomics)
 - o Fabric Genomics acquired by Gene DX
 - o Al used with complex data sets
 - Move to whole genome sequencing
 - Sequence together and report out in panels
 - More of a global reach to diversify, driven by NHRGI, things have changed in communication about this
 - Industry aspect, funding themselves, not coming from US govt money
 - Big layoffs Illumina, PacBio, Roche and BioRad
 - Roche is investing \$50M in pharmaceuticals and diagnostics in US over next 5 years
 - Lots of talent in the marketplace
 - Rocky for biotech employment, starting to stabilize, demand for labor now
