Choose English or Math Guided Self-Placement.





Assessment for placement is one of the critical steps to help students start on a successful pathway in college. It is critical that you understand your placement options and your rights to access transfer-level English coursework. This website will guide you through placement by asking you about high school completion and GPA, using multiple measures, and sharing course options with you.

The English Guided Self-Placement will use high school completion and GPA to help you determine which transfer-level English class is best for you.

- Students without a diploma from a U.S. high school or a G.E.D. might benefit from meeting with a counselor
- ELL graduates of U.S. high schools have higher rates of completing transfer-level English when they start with that course. ELL students can take LPC ESL courses, however, if they feel they would benefit from them; these students should consult the Assessment Center webpage for ESL assessment dates and times. They also might benefit from meeting with a counselor.
- The English Multiple Measures Self-Placement will use AP scores and/or previous college coursework for second-level transfer



Your recommended placement is English 1A (ENG 1A), Critical Reading and Composition.

ENG 1A is a 3.0-unit course that is CSU and UC transferable to satisfy General Education (GE) re

Summer 2024 students may instead take English 1AEX (ENG 1AEX), an equivalent course that in Table below for more information on both courses and the English Support Options link.

Fall 2024 students may access support through a tuition-free non-credit NENG 215 (NENG 215) to support students through the rigor of English 1A.

ELL graduates of U.S. high schools have higher rates of completing transfer-level English when the alternatively, ELL students might opt for LPC NESL courses for free alongside of their English courtimes.
