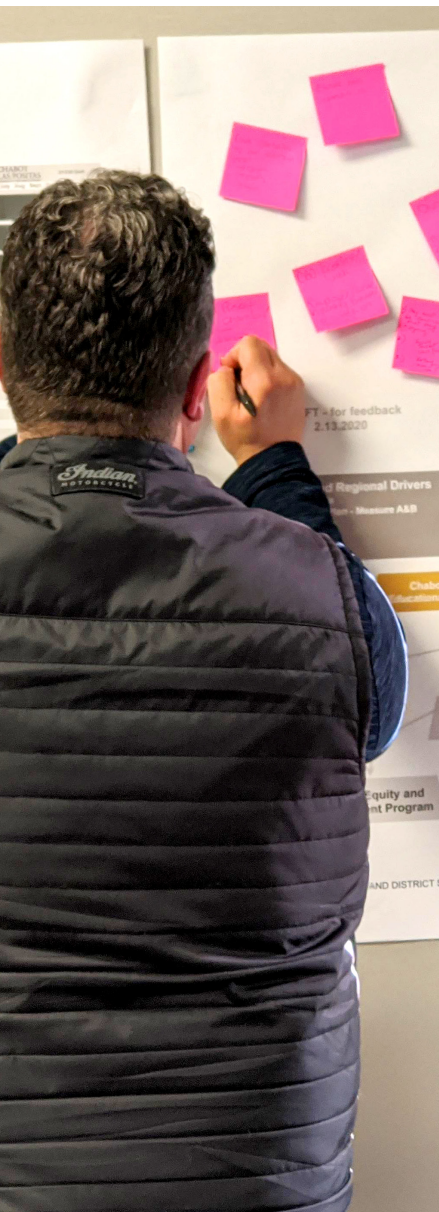

CREATING A STRONG FOUNDATION FOR OUR COLLECTIVE FUTURE

District-Wide CLPCCD EMPs/DSP Launch

Our District officially launched its year-long strategic planning initiative on February 13, 2020. Interim Chancellor Gerhard convened key decision-makers across the District to ensure a strong start to the district-wide planning effort. Key administrators present included Chabot College President Susan Sperling, Las Positas College President Dyrell Foster, Vice Chancellor of Educational Services and Student Success (VCESS) Theresa Fleischer Rowland, Vice Chancellor of Human Resources Wyman Fong, CC Director of Institutional Effectiveness Samantha Kessler, and LPC Director of Research, Planning and Institutional Effectiveness Rajinder Samra. Academic Senate Presidents Miguel Colon (CC) and Sarah Thompson (LPC), Classified Senate Presidents Noell Adams (CC) and David Rodriguez (LPC), and Associated Students Leader Blessing Nkrumah (LPC) brought expertise to the table. Together, these individuals will form the District-Wide Comprehensive Planning Guidance & Coordinating Committee (DGCC), to guide and coordinate Comprehensive Planning in accordance with **Board policy 3250** for the two College Educational Master Plans (EMPs) and the District Strategic Plan (DSP). The DGCC members were joined by key consultants from the Signature Solutions Corporate Results (SSCR) team, hired to assist with the facilitation, research, writing, and design of the three plans.

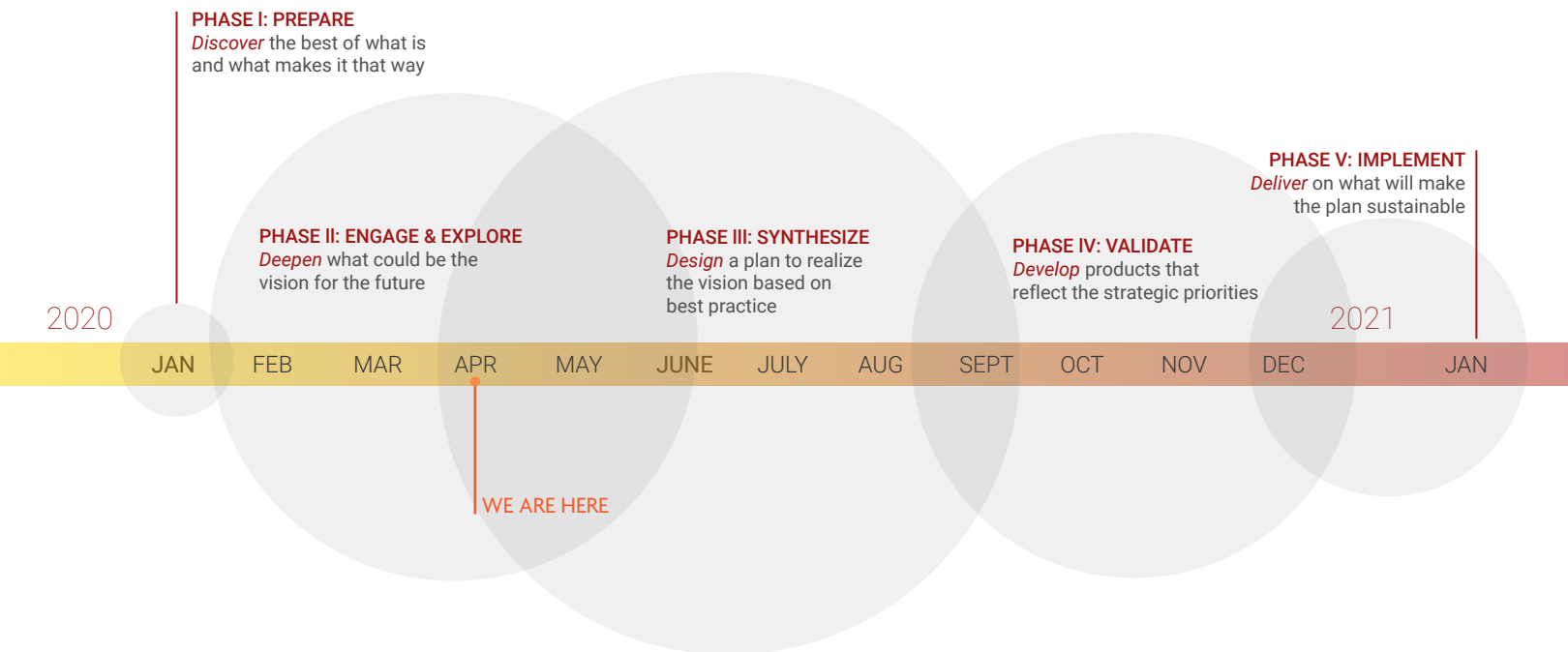
At the outset of the meeting, Chancellor Gerhard provided an overview of the purpose of the Comprehensive Planning Initiative and invited each participant to introduce themselves and share their hopes for the district-wide process. The representatives expressed their vision for an “authentic and meaningful” planning process that would result in College adopted priorities and align with district-wide strategic goals for the next six years. Participants spoke of the importance of collaboration and inclusion and obtaining the “buy-in” of all the key players. Most importantly, the speakers underscored the importance of serving students and placing students at the heart of the process.

Vice Chancellor Rowland facilitated discussion on ensuring transparent, pro-active, and clear messaging to engage meaningful work. This set the stage for an initial review of sample Guiding Principles that emphasized “unite, honor, and guide.” Also discussed were two related handouts, “Leveraging Key Priorities” and a “Planning Timeline with Milestones.”



The group talked about the need to clarify the DGCC’s purpose and role going forward. Members then broke out into three smaller groups, representing the Colleges and District Office, to discuss outreach strategies. The meeting concluded with the consultants sharing a heart-shaped concept image created for the CLPCCD planning process to illustrate the student-centered focus of the planning effort with the slogan “Students are the heart of the matter.”

EMBRACING A COLLEGE-DRIVEN INTEGRATIVE PLANNING MODEL AT CLPCCD

The District-wide Comprehensive Planning Initiative has been designed with Chancellor’s Council and reflects the intention to remain both collaborative and integrative throughout. This spring, Chabot and Las Positas Colleges will embark on an intensive college-wide planning process with internal and external stakeholders engaged. The Educational Master Plans (EMPs) will result reflecting the strategic priorities of the individual Colleges. These individual College plans will inform the District Strategic Plan (DSP), along with local governing Board of Trustees Priorities and statewide mandates, such as Vision for Success, to ultimately document the District-wide strategic priorities.

While the Colleges lead their EMP planning process, they are also coordinating with the District to ensure efforts are integrated and thoughtfully aligned throughout the year-long comprehensive planning process. To collaborate on a common approach, the following integrative planning tasks are objectives early on:

- Review EMPs and DSPs from peer California community colleges to gather effective structure and content ideas, and develop a common framework where possible;
- Develop a comprehensive Environmental Scan of external factors to consider when setting District-wide goals;
- Create a “cross-walk” of concurrent planning initiatives across the Colleges and District, and determine ways to integrate these planning efforts within the emerging EMPs and DSP.
