

#### ALAMEDA COUNTY ARTS COMMISSION

Now accepting submissions from Alameda County artists for 3 new opportunities.

Artists who make two-dimensional, low-relief, or wall sculptural artwork, and artists at all levels of professional development are invited to apply.

#### CALL FOR ARTISTS

SMALL SCALE ARTWORK COMMISSION PROGRAM
Application Deadline: June 30, 2008

Artists are invited to submit their qualifications for 2 Small Scale Artwork Commission Program opportunities. This program will commission Alameda County artists to produce a new series of artwork in the studio. At the end of the contract period, the artists' output will become part of the Alameda County Art Collection: Artwork Created by Alameda County Artists. The artwork will be installed at the Juvenile Justice Center and at the Sobering and Detoxification Centers. Artists should note that the users of these facilities need to experience works of art that have positive themes and contribute to a safe and supportive environment.

#### Juvenile Justice Center

Up to \$110,000 is available to commission approximately 15 artists to make new artwork for this facility. The program will commission artists at three levels of professional development (emerging, mid-career, and established).

#### Sobering & Detoxification Centers

Up to \$34,000 is available to commission approximately 4-6 artists to make new artwork for these two centers.

#### CALL FOR ARTWORK

PURCHASE OF EXISTING ARTWORK Application Deadline: May 30, 2008

The Arts Commission is building a public collection of artwork created by Alameda County artists. Artwork purchased through the 2008 Purchase Program will become part of the *Alameda County Art Collection: Artwork by Alameda County Artists* and will be placed at County buildings. The goal of this program is to continue to collect artwork that is of high-quality and original in design and idea and that reflects the wide range of excellent artwork created by Alameda County artists with diversity in style, medium, and concept. The *Art Collection* includes artwork that illuminates the history, culture, language, and traditions of this region; engenders a sense of continuity and belonging among the members of our community; and promotes understanding of cultural values and perspectives of all people. Up to \$75,000 is available this year to purchase existing artwork.

Applications for these public art projects must be submitted online through the CaFE website (www.callforentry.org).
