Alternative Academic Calendar Committee (AACC): Aubrie:

David: We met in January last week to go over the process of making a final recommendation to the Chancellor. They talk about how will the voting occur, what kind of recommendation there would be, ultimately, we are going to have one month to figure out whether the committee makes a recommendation to move it forward. It will be anonymous. Hopefully, that helps people vote rather than voting under pressure. What will the recommendation include? Move the compressed calendar forward or not? Those are the type of conversations that will probably be happening on March 1st. What are the ongoing questions that the committee has?

Jason: I think you covered everything perfectly. Yes, these conversations are going to continue. Our final vote occurs on March 1st. If there are any last-minute conversations anyone in this room has, please reach out to us so we bring your concerns to the table.

Aubrie: I have a question for Brody – did she reach out to you as well?

Brody: Yes. We will be having two meetings in February. Next week will be our official senate meeting of the semester.

Jason: When we had these forums, these public discussions, there was a lot of material presented to different groups in different areas that were not passed through the actual committee to review. Counseling, Admissions and Records, etc. We had two speakers to share their experiences – a lot of work and stress was placed upon Classified.

David: I want to summarize the process. It seemed rushed. The language they are using now is different language. I think there are a lot of areas that remain unstudied. If you look underneath the surface there are a lot of unanswered questions. The process has been lackluster in a way and a lot of missing parts I think.

Aubrie: Thank you. If possible, it would be amazing if folks can participate – they will be doing this on Zoom and in person at the District Office on March 1st. I don't think they took into consideration folks' schedules. It is unfortunate that they did not ask what availability works the best. I don't think Classified voices are being heard. Keep in mind in 2025-2026, we would be starting to see the restriction in our funds. DEMC: The conversation they are going to have I am sharing this in case you have any questions or concerns in DEMC they will be looking at the schedule builder. They are trying to look at some data and improve scheduling and how they put classes on the schedule. Some critical metrics. Any questions about that? PBC: The Chancellor is going to make a presentation on the current enrollment trends. They will go over what the budget status is what was budgeted last Fall and what has been spent, etc. And that is all, stay tuned, there will probably be more details in the next Classified meeting.
