Describe the specific equipment requested and how it will be used to replace, upgrade or provide new technology to LPC from what is currently in place:
We are asking for a combination of items that are used for our intercollegiate swim & dive team, intercollegiate water polo teams, and aquatic classes. Our equipment has spent more time being repaired than in usage the past two seasons, and we have been relying on the generosity of the community to borrow equipment to keep our home competition events operating.
The items requested are replacing equipment used for training and competition, and both replacements and new equipment/technology. This equipment was purchased in 2008 when the pool was first constructed, and is part of an interconnected system.
Colorado Timing Console (GEN 7). New technology to replace our old one. The one we have was fixed for the last time, as they are phasing out the 16 year old system! We have been operating for 10 years now on 16 year old computer technology. This is used for both Intercollegiate Swimming & Diving and Intercollegiate Water Polo programs, as well as for swimming fitness and water polo classes.
Colorado Touch Pads. Replacement. Original pads were purchased in 2008.
Touchpad Caddy. The new pads will need to be stored and transported safely. The old broken ones will be used for training/practice.
Timing buttons. Replacements. Original ones were purchased in 2008.
Banana Plugs. Used to fix connectors for touch pads, buttons, and speakers that all connect to the timing system. Corrosion due to pool chemicals is always an issue, and we use them to prolong the life of the
