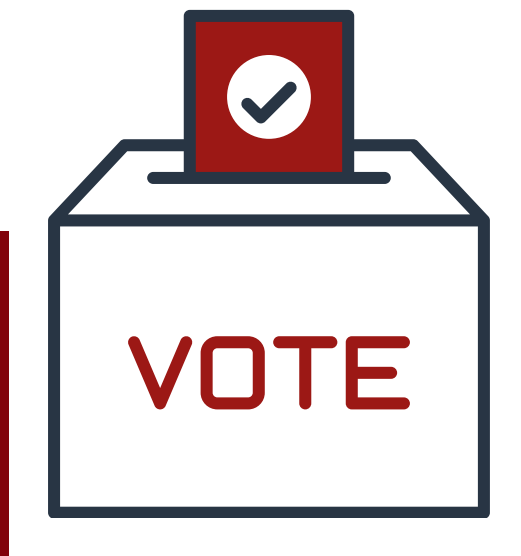

This taught me that the most valuable resources often go unused without effective outreach and presentation. In student government, I would focus on bridging this gap between important services and student engagement. I'd work to make critical resources; whether financial aid workshops, mental health support, or academic services—more visible and appealing through creative marketing, peer ambassadors, and strategic timing with registration or other key student deadlines. My experience with outreach challenges gives me unique insight into how to connect students with resources they need but might not naturally pursue.

Second, as an undocumented student myself, I understand that despite the resources our campus offers, many of my peers still need better guidance to reach their full potential. I'd work to ensure resources actually reach the students who need them most, with clear pathways and support for immigrant and undocumented students in particular.

Third, making it easier for students to find clubs and get involved. Having founded a club, I know firsthand both the challenges and the importance of student organizations. When students connect with others who share their interests, they do better academically and feel more at home on campus.

For each of these, I'd talk to students directly about their experiences, partner with the right departments, and focus on creating practical solutions that make a real difference in students' lives.
