 - David has not been hiring this year
 - Cal Osha plans to start hiring, maybe because of anticipation of increased enforcement
 - Steve has a former student who has been at Cal Osha for 3 years and enjoys it and shares with current classes
 - Emerging Trends
 - Respiratory protection N95 masks
 - \$49 M fine for Kaiser for waste compliance
 - Martials and Weights program
 - Entry level safety professional, hard to find. Need for lower level safety technicians.

- 6. Program Report**
 - Program Review
 - 12 completed this year; compared to the last year, 6 of 12 were from LPC The other 6 were from West Valley CC
 - 161 postings for those job titles
 - How can we work with Beth. Beth started her career in OSHA.
 - Are the students who come to LPC employed already?
 - Most of the LPC OSH students and RAD students are working adults. The minority are under 30 years old. A number are around 50 and working in some capacity. Looking for a degree or certificate
 - Also have been able to incorporate OSHA training institute workshops into classes
 - 3 workshops so far this year 7205, 300
 - For the cost of OSH 60 students who successfully complete the class get credit for OSH class ANSD CREDIT FOR 3 CERTIFICATES

○ Each semester bringing OSHA workshops in class

- Opportunity for up to 9-10 certificates
- Telsa and water boards looking for safety training
- Some grads employed by LLNL, Engineering Tech need safety training
- Update on OSH 60 (class this semester), 19 students doing well, 17 students have perfect attendance, and the other 2 have missed 1 class
- Search for potential OSH instructors- looking to bring in new instructors, Steve is teaching all 4 classes. Steve is looking to step back. He would like to keep one class. He has identified 5 people. He is meeting with them next week. 3 are LLNL employees. One is in insurance 1 is currently teaching, meeting with them next week.
- Search for potential Outreach instructors for OTIEC – may be a candidate among the 3 people Steve is meeting next week. Training institute is looking for outreach instructors.
- ASSP scholarships are \$1000 each, and 2 scholarships are going to 2 LPC students. One scholarship from construction, one from the whole organization
- Status of RADS classes
 - LLNL response to Board's motion to remove RADS 40A-C
 - John Gundlefinger, a health physicist at LLNL, LLNL would like time to digest this idea and come back with a proposal
 - Would like to keep 40 A, B, C and increase the presence of RADS in a model at CC in Las Alamos, NM
 - Possible AS in Radiation Safety
 - Possibly replace LLNL RCT Training program that all health and safety techs take at LLNL take
 - Group from LLNL will contact Tom to discuss further
