### **LPC Launches Work-Based Learning Initiative**

Fueling Economic Development, Building Employer Partnerships, Providing Services to Hire Interns



LPC's award-winning Early Childhood Development Program trains teachers for our community and provides many work-based learning opportunities.

LPC's new Work-Based Learning Initiative supports the college's pivotal role in building the area workforce, fueling economic development, and providing new opportunities for employers, students, and alumni. The college's Career Technical Education (CTE) Program administers the initiative, which includes specialists who visit community employers, activities supporting workbased learning, and a new College Central Network Services website connecting employers with qualified students and alumni. LPC graduates are represented in many career fields in our region. The college's CTE Program focuses on specific industry sectors, ensuring a talent pipeline of skilled workers from our college to the workplace. Following are the industry sectors served by LPC's CTE Program: Public Safety and Health Sciences, Business and Entrepreneurship, Advanced Manufacturing and Transportation, and Information, Communication and Technology.

### **Work-Based Learning Specialists**

Four new Work-Based Learning Specialists serve as liaisons with area industry sectors, increasing our already strong connections with employers and paving pathways for more partnerships. Benefits for employers include recruiting employees and influencing curriculum development to meet industry requirements. Benefits for students and alumni include jobs, internships, and other work-based learning opportunities.

### **Work-Based Learning Activities**

LPC has always offered a rich array of work-based learning opportunities. The initiative seeks to increase these activities, such as internships, job shadowing, field trips, guest lecturers, career-related student competitions, work experience, service learning, and faculty externships.

### **Three Students, Instructor Earn Top Honors**

LPC congratulates three students and an instructor for winning prestigious honor society awards this month.

### Awards from National Honor Society for Two-Year Colleges Phi Theta Kappa

The honor society Phi Theta Kappa has announced that LPC student **Brianna Armario** has been named a 2016 Coca-Cola Community College Academic Team Gold Scholar, one of only 50 Gold Scholars from across the country. Selection as a Coca-Cola Gold Scholar was based on scores the student earned in the All-USA Community College Academic Team competition, which had more than 1,900 applications. Ms. Armario, from Pleasanton, is majoring in Economics and Spanish. Additionally, Ms. Armario and **Nancy Kang** made the First Team of the All-California Team of Phi Theta Kappa. Ms. Kang, an international student from China, is majoring in Math and serves as a student trustee. Both students are active in many LPC organizations. They were among only 31 students from throughout the state who placed on the First Team and were honored at a ceremony sponsored by the Community College League of California.

#### Awards from the California Community College Honor Society Alpha Gamma Sigma

At the Alpha Gamma Sigma (AGS) state convention, **Ms. Armario** received the Kathleen D. Loly Academic Award and **Ms. Kang** received the Tom Jackson Academic, Service, and Leadership Award, making her the top AGS student in the state. This is the sixth time in the 10-year history of the Jackson Award that it has gone to an LPC student. **Claire Huestis**, a Chemical Engineering major living in Livermore, received the Ed Walsh Service Award. Retired Math Instructor and AGS Advisor Emeritus **Randy Taylor** was presented with the 2016 AGS Distinguished Service Award, and also was honored with the creation of a new award, the Randy Taylor Service Award, given to the AGS student with the top service in the state.
