LPC Students Participate in Women's March Tri-Valley

The City of Pleasanton was host to its first ever Women's march held January 19, 2019 in downtown Pleasanton. The goal of the annual marches is to advocate legislation and policies regarding human rights and other issues, including women's rights, immigration reform, healthcare reform, reproductive rights, the environment, LGBTQ rights, racial equality, freedom of religion, workers' rights and tolerance. This year's formal march was held in Washington, D.C., and over 100 other marches were planned for cities across the country.



At the City of Pleasanton march there were several speakers including Angela Vasquez, Las Positas College Inter Students Club chair, who spoke from her experiences as a self described dreamer and advocated for the support of undocumented students. *"My ultimate goal is to ensure that I have a voice for undocumented students all around campus because I've felt alone at some point... and I want to make sure that nobody else at Las Positas College thinks that they are alone just because of their status,"* she said. *"No person should ever feel like an outcast just because of where they came from."* Ms. Vasquez was joined by Alisha Shaik, Las Positas College student and the rally's emcee, and Lylah Schmedel, Las Positas Student Gov., President and Black Student Union, Public Relations, Director.



LPC News in Brief

Measure A Open House: - Las Positas College will share its updated Draft Facilities Master Plan (FMP) with the Las Positas College and Tri-Valley community on **February 6, 2019**.

Developed to include priority projects that fit the needs of the educational future of the campus, the FMP is a result of Measure A, which authorized the sale of \$950 million of capital improvement bonds to help the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District (CLPCCD) fund major projects.

Designed to be a living document that will be reviewed and updated every six years, the FMP provides the appropriate action steps necessary to guide the development of the Las Positas College campus. Additionally, the FMP identifies guiding design principles for the development of buildings, outdoor spaces, mobility and infrastructure upgrades, as well as physical improvements envisioned for the campus.

The draft plans will be on display for staff, faculty, students and community members to view and provide comments until **March 15, 2019**. As well as to note their preference on which projects should be prioritized prior to the FMP receiving final approval from the Board of Trustees.

Cyber Generations: LPC Community Education and the AFA (Air Force Academy) are offering training to senior computer users and enthusiasts. The course is divided into an introduction and four sections: Password Management; Common Internet Threat; Internet Scams and Fraud and Social Media Safety. The AFA is in their eleventh year of National Youth Cyber Education Program and they are offering this same cutting edge, current knowledge and training to senior computer users and enthusiasts.
