

LLNL & Las Positas College Meet to Discuss Furthering Partnerships and Workforce Pipeline



Officials with Las Positas College (LPC) and the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District (CLPCCD) visited Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory (LLNL) on August 9 to learn more about Lab-related opportunities available to students and discuss strengthening partnerships between the two institutions.

President Dyrell Foster, who was visiting the Lab for the first time, attended the meeting, along with CLPCCD Chancellor Ron Gerhard and others from the college.

Engineering Directorate leadership were joined by adjunct professors at LPC who teach students while working for the Lab, as well as graduates of the Engineering Technology Program (also known as Vets2Tech), who described the impact of the award-winning program on their careers.

The meeting kicked off with overview presentations of the Laboratory and collaborative education program by LLNL University Relations and Science Education Director Eric Schwegler and Science Education Program Director Joanna Albala, respectively, highlighting Lab/LPC collaborations such as workshops, the LLNL/LPC Science and Engineering Seminar Series and the Teacher Research Academy.

President Dr. Foster followed by introducing LLNL attendees to recent activities and initiatives at the college, which is currently focusing on student retention through its career pathways program, providing student support through “success teams” and job readiness through resume-building internships, and is undergoing expansion, including construction of a new Advanced Manufacturing and Transportation facility.

“This meeting will hopefully be a launchpad to more opportunities,” Foster said. “I’m excited for what the future holds.”

The status, which requires Steinway and Steinway-designed pianos to be used in all performance spaces, piano teaching studios and practice rooms, positions the Livermore community college among the most elite music schools and conservatories across the globe.

"I am thrilled that Las Positas College has become an All-Steinway School after many years of hard work," said LPC music department coordinator Dan Marschak, who is also the college's director of piano pedagogy, composition, music theory and piano. "This designation has been a major goal of the LPC Music Department and the LPC Foundation, and we couldn't be more excited for our students to learn, rehearse and perform on a brand-new Steinway Model B Spirio | r."



The Steinway Spirio | r is described on the Steinway website as "the world's finest high-resolution player piano capable of live performance capture and playback" and "a revolutionary blend of artistry, craftsmanship and technology (providing powerful new tools of expression and new ways to access, share and experience performance."



Students using the piano will have the ability to record themselves playing and immediately listen to the recording, as well as play accurate historical recordings and participate in live masterclass in real time.

The College will be celebrating this milestone with a Gala Fundraising event on September 17th from 6pm-8pm, to ensure that there will be adequate maintenance for the fleet of pianos as well as Steinway Artist Masterclasses for students.
