The President's Scholars Program is a vehicle to provide the opportunity for students in our local service area to attend Las Positas College without any financial barriers. The Scholars program is a financial need-based program that is intended to promote equity by providing financial support to outstanding scholars attending Las Positas College. The program includes a full scholarship that covers tuition, fees, parking, and textbooks for two years. This comprehensive program offers outstanding opportunities for leadership, service and mentorship.

#### Eligibility to Apply

- Be a high school senior in good academic standing with a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 from one of the following districts:
  - Livermore Valley Joint Unified School District
  - Dublin Unified School District
  - Castro Valley Unified School District
  - Pleasanton Unified School District
  - San Ramon Unified School District
  - Lammersville Unified School District
  - Tracy Unified School District
- Have applied for admission to Las Positas College for the fall 2023 semester
- Must plan to enroll full-time, at least 12 units each term, while pursuing an associate degree, with the intent to transfer for a four-year college or university
- Complete the President's Scholars Application

### President Speaker Series Presents Dr. Victor Rios

Dr. Victor Rios, Professor of Sociology & MacArthur Foundation Chair at U.C. Santa Barbara, spoke at the Spring Flex Day Keynote Session on the topic of "Educator Projected Self-Actualization in Community College." His research on students who overcome adversity to successfully navigate the higher education pipeline has demonstrated that resilience is often actuated by an emotionally-relevant educator.

His presentation emphasized the importance of emotional support from educators in the lives of marginalized students. Dr. Rios discussed how educators play a powerful role in guiding students that have been left behind, and provided many anecdotes with practical strategies that have worked in helping these at-promise students succeed in higher education.

This spring LPC was approved to participate in the California Community Colleges Institutional Effectiveness Partnership Initiative (IEPI) which makes technical assistance available to institutions through full Partnership Resource Teams (PRTs). As part of the request, the College identified the Area of Focus to be centered on the implementation of Student Success Teams.

During the PRT's first visit in February, the team gathered information and established scope through interviews and meetings with designated individuals and groups. The intent was to learn more about the College's progress, challenges, and desired outcomes related to the implementation of Student Success Teams. During the second and final visit on March 16, the PRT team recommended

resources and interventions that the College could implement, and discussed ideas to identify areas for continued enhancement of the college's Student Success Teams as part of the Pathways initiatives.

### Congressman Mark DeSaulnier Visits LPC

On Thursday, February 16, Congressman Mark DeSaulnier and members of his staff honored Las Positas College with a campus visit as part of their Educational Listening Tour. Congressman DeSaulnier has served as the U.S. representative for California's 10th Congressional District since 2015. The district includes most of Contra Costa County and parts or Alameda County. In Congress, DeSaulnier is known for his work on issues such as transportation infrastructure, education, and healthcare, as well as his advocacy for consumer protection and government accountability.

During his visit to LPC, Congressman DeSaulnier first met with Dr. Foster, CLPCCD Chancellor Gerhard, Board President Sbranti, and other Board Trustees and members of the LPC leadership team. The group then went on a tour of the LPC campus that included stops at the LPC Welcome Center and Mini-market, the Veteran's Center, new Horticulture Center and Academic Building 1000 where Congressman DeSaulnier held an informational session with 25 currently enrolled students. The campus tour ended in the cafeteria with a meeting and Q&A session attended by LPC faculty members, administrators, students, and LPC Foundation board members.

### JAMS Take Top Honors

The Journalism And Media Studies (JAMS) department had quite the weekend in San Francisco on March 11. The Express newspaper, Naked magazine, and the Havik journal – were recognized as among the best student media in America. Both Associated College Press Associated College Press (ACP) and Journalism Association of Community Colleges (JACC) awarded LPC media students with top honors.

For the second consecutive year in the ACP's national competition, Havik was named First Place Best of Show for literary arts publications among two-year schools. The latest publication, We Are Here! published in 2022, features creative writings from students, community members, and, thanks to an electronic submission system, contributors from around the world. Havik is a joint publication of JAMS and the LPC English department, co-advised by English Professor Martin Nash and JAMS Professor Melissa Korber, who both attended the conference.



The Talk Hawks LPC's Forensics intercollegiate competition in the the areas of public speaking, oral interpretation of literature, readers theater, and debate took it all at the Northern California Forensics Association 2023 Championship Tournament. The LPC team finished first place, ahead of all other participating institutions.

Currently the team is traveling to Tokyo, Japan to represent LPC at the International Forensics Association's Championship Tournament.
