ACCJC ACCREDITATION VISIT AT LPC

On October 11, LPC concluded the ACCJC Accreditation Visit with an Exit Report. During the brief Exit Report, Dr. Timothy Karas, the Chair of the Peer Review Team, acknowledged the beautiful campus and noted the visiting team received sufficient answers to their questions regarding the four core inquiries related to LPC (and the one core inquiry related to the district office), and did not have any outstanding questions or concerns. It was evident to the visiting team that LPC puts "students first" and that students are at the center of the college's decision making. The visiting team was able to observe and experience the high level of collaboration, collegiality, and care that staff and faculty have for one another. He noted that there were instances during the Open Forum when members of our college community took liberty to acknowledge other colleagues or their respective departments for their outstanding work. Collectively, the College as a whole should feel good about this process, the college responses and the great work that continues at LPC. Congratulations on a job well done!
