- Reflect on reading/summarizing process
 - Process went smoothly.
 - Scheduling the meeting was challenging
 - It was hard for deans to allot enough time for a 1.5-2 hour meeting; it was challenging to get the summary written in only an hour.
 - Stuart would like to note that his team was excellent!
 - Clearer expectations and better training for deans—Chair could visit a Dean's meeting
 - Clarify who is in charge of the department
 - Two conflicting timelines or messages re: skipping PRs, updates vs. full PRs.
 - Irena suggested having a required PR align with the SLO reporting year. This will be a waltz pattern. Full-update-update, full-update-update.
 - We need to check with SLO committee about this.
 - We also need to check with IPEC, Academic Senate, and Accreditation task force.
 - Is allowing people to skip sending a message that the PR is either not necessary and too much of a burden?
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- Record any glitches, challenges, or desired changes to templates and/or processes
 - Accomplishments and challenges are often blending together and leading to redundancies
 - Go to a bullet point template—LIST your challenges etc!
 - Question about barriers to equity seemed important but redundant—could it be incorporated elsewhere?

- How can SLO/IR data analysis be better reflected in the summary?
 - Summary template categories don't align neatly with the PR form categories.
 - Template is text-heavy which leads to anxiety—hard to find where to type. So much text at the beginning, and it's hard to see where people are writing.
 - Make a website with all this info that's on the front page of the template—(or this may exist already) and have a video
 - Make the PR website home page more for program review writers
 - Look into Canvas? Enroll all FT-faculty and add Classified and PT as needed. We could also look into curricunet.
 - Meet with Tim and get the website updated
- Determine updates/changes/goals for next year's Program Review template and process
 - Priorities for Spring Semester
 - Wellness
 - Add pain points not connected to your program! This could be added to the department pain point question.
 - More work time in our meeting—bring our laptop
 - Data analysis—Review Hannah Lawler's presentation
