


#### **Definitions:**

Total Course Enrollments is the sum of all course enrollments (filled seats) within the discipline.






Continuing: Students enrolled in the current semester and were enrolled in the previous primary term. Primary terms are Fall and Spring.

Concurrent Enrollment: A special admit student currently enrolled in K-12.



Transfer: Students who want to transfer to a 4-year university. Includes students enrolled in 4-year institutions completing requirements at LPC.


Occupational Certificate/Job Training: Acquire job skills, explore career interests, earn a certificate, or maintain a certificate/license.

Other: Students completing diploma/GED requirements or moving from non-credit to credit courses. Data from admission application.







#### **Definitions:**

FTES is the total Full Time Equivalent Student value resulting from all enrollment within the discipline.


FTEF is the Full Time Equivalent Faculty associated with the discipline's course offerings for that semester.


**Productivity** is the ratio of WSCH to FTEF and a standard measure of discipline efficiency.
